Dear Parents and Carers,

I felt it timely and appropriate to share with you some key updates and important information regarding the coming weeks as well as plans moving forward into September.

Educational Provision

As many of you will be aware, we have now been open to wider year groups since Monday 15th June including Reception, Year 1 and Year 6. I am delighted to see so many happy faces returning to school day after day which is a huge credit to the planning and preparation of the staff and support from parents and carers. If your circumstances have changed and you now require a place, please contact the school office and we will do all we can to support.

For those children who are currently still at home I hope you are all doing well and staying safe. This week, several members of staff will make contact once again to speak directly with the children. I hope this has been well received as I know the staff have really enjoyed listening to the many stories of lockdown. Education for children who remain at home will continue through the learning packs and online support via Class Dojo, etc. Any staff who continue to work from home will be available to provide support and guidance as appropriate. If you have any specific queries for your child's class teacher, please make contact via Class Dojo or the main school office. As the majority of staff are now teaching on site in bubbles each day, please bear in mind that the return communication will not be instant. Thank you, as always, for your continued support with your child's learning.

Transition

As part of our typical school calendar, this week would usually mark the start of our transition activities with all year groups. Given current restrictions, our typical transition process has been reviewed and adapted. We have planned a number of activities to ensure a smooth and stress free transition for your child into their next year group. This week you will receive more information about this in our Transition Booklets. As part of this process, we hope to be able to offer a virtual meeting between children and staff in the very near future.

I have been working closely with Lord Derby Academy regarding transition. The Assistant Headteacher in charge of Transition at LDA, Mrs Ellis, is in the process of planning 1:1 induction meetings for every Year 6 child, accompanied by one parent or carer. The purpose of this meeting is to cover, as far as possible, the information that is usually disseminated during the Parental Induction Evening and the Secondary Induction Day. You will receive an appointment in the post in due course.

Recovery Curriculum

We are acutely aware that our curriculum offer, once children return to school, will have to be carefully considered given recent National events. Already, as a Trust, a team of specialists are researching and planning what our "Recovery Curriculum" offer will look like.

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Our “Recovery Curriculum” will aim to focus on 5 core principles. The 5 Rs:

- Routines
- Relationships
- Retrieve
- Re-map
- Reteach/accelerate

Reestablishing school routines and rebuilding teacher/pupil relationships is paramount to ensure children are safe and happy contributing to positive wellbeing. Once these have been achieved, pupils will then be sensitively assessed to give teachers an understanding of lost, and in some cases accelerated learning, over the time they have spent at home. This knowledge will then allow staff to teach specifically to each child’s individual needs. The timetable has been remodelled to insist on an importance of the core subjects alongside the statutory requirements of physical education and religious education. Foundation subjects will be taught in a much more thematic approach whilst still ensuring all National Curriculum objectives are being addressed. This curriculum will be in place for the first half term only.

Staffing update

Provision is under regular review to ensure that the best education is provided for all pupils in our Trust. With this in mind, I would like you to be aware of the following updates to staffing as part of our ongoing collaboration across both Blacklow Brow and Park View Academy. First, I am delighted to congratulate Mrs Williams on an exciting new cross Trust role effective from September 2020. Mrs Williams will support curriculum development across all Dean Trust Primary Schools. She will be greatly missed as Head of School and we look forward to continuing our work together in the future. As a result, Mr Morland will take up the new post of Deputy Headteacher at Park View Academy, alongside with his position of Year 6 class teacher. In addition, Mr Latham will be taking up the new post of Deputy Headteacher at Blacklow Brow School. I know you will join me in congratulating them both and wishing them all the best in their new role.

In an 18-month period the school population has grown by 42 children. This has meant that we will be building a new classroom over the summer break and will be joined by a new teachers in September.
