NSPCC Speak out. Stay safe. programme



Protecting a generation of children against abuse. Find out how we can help your school.

On Wednesday 23rd January the NSPCC came into school and delivered an assembly and workshops to Yrs 5&6 on how to speak out and stay safe. This programme aims to equip children with the knowledge and understanding they need to stay safe from abuse and neglect. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried and that they should talk to a trusted adult or Childline.

The children met Buddy, a friendly, speech bubble who believes that children should be able to speak out to someone if they're worried or unhappy.
