Curriculum

At Park View Academy, we believe that learning is a lifelong process that should be a rewarding and enjoyable experience for everyone. Through our curriculum and teaching, we focus on inspiring our children to learn, equipping them with the skills, knowledge and understanding necessary to be independent learners.

We are proud to offer a broad curriculum that seeks to create opportunities for pupils to excel in a range of activities that enhance and extend the National Curriculum. Children have opportunities both inside and outside the classroom which includes trips, workshops, visiting speakers and much more.

Pupils' learning in the foundation subjects is organised into topics. Alongside these topics, children develop their basic skills of reading, writing and maths every day to ensure a broad foundation for learning. We encourage reading, writing and maths to be fully embedded within the whole curriculum.

At Park View Academy, children are taught phonics through 'Letters and Sounds'. Throughout the school, the children have access to quality texts and books from a variety of reading schemes.

Assessment

Our aim at Park View Academy is to raise aspirations amongst pupils and staff. Our dedicated staff are up to date with the latest developments in education. Children are encouraged to not only do their best but to challenge themselves to achieve beyond what they perceived they could do. To do this we are committed to providing a curriculum that is both inspiring and exciting, which encourages deeper thinking skills.

Aspirational targets are set at the beginning of the school year and are regularly monitored. These targets take into account each child's starting point and provide a pathway to success that is both challenging but ultimately achievable.

Park View Academy is a high achieving school that not only secures good SATs results but offers a well-rounded curriculum for our pupils.

Special Needs and Disability

Park View Academy is an inclusive school and children with a range of special needs are very successfully included in our mainstream setting, with effective support targeted to meet their needs and help them reach their full potential.



High Achievers

More able pupils are challenged to allow them to flourish and leave our school with the highest outcomes possible. This is done by providing them with problem solving activities, challenges and tasks that require them to apply their learning in a range of situations.

Homework

At Park View Academy we believe that the school/parent relationship is key to promoting learning beyond the school gates and crucial in ensuring children make the best possible progress.

Homework is a very important tool to consolidate learning in class and to encourage further progress. The main focus of homework is reading, spelling, maths and basic skills.

On occasion, there may also be project based homework linked to the foundation subjects such as history or art.

Our extended day and flexible approach supports working families but also provides the best opportunities for our children.

Nursery



Park View Academy Nursery provides children with an outstanding level of care combined with a warm, secure and stimulating environment.

We pride ourselves on delivering a fun and balanced curriculum for all our pupils that develops their skills and confidence in preparation for the transition into Reception.

We work as an integrated Early Years Foundtaion Stage team across Nursery and Reception. Our nursery is staffed with a nursery teacher, a nursery teaching assistant and the EYFS lead with responsibility for the whole unit. All of our nursery staff are fully trained in paediatric first aid.

Our nursery can accommodate a maximum of 26 children between the ages of three and four years. Our numbers are small so that all children receive lots of individual attention from staff who are experienced, dedicated and professional. The children’s day starts at 8.30am for 15 hour (part-time) children and at 9.00am for 30 hour (full-time) children.

The 30-Hour Offer

All children are entitled to three hours of free Nursery education (Core Offer) between the hours of 8.45am-11.45am. However, due to new legislation, eligible parents/carers may apply for an additional 15 hours.
