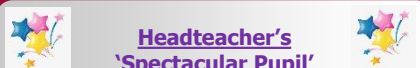

We used the nursery rhyme Twinkle, twinkle little star and changed the words to link in with anti bullying week.

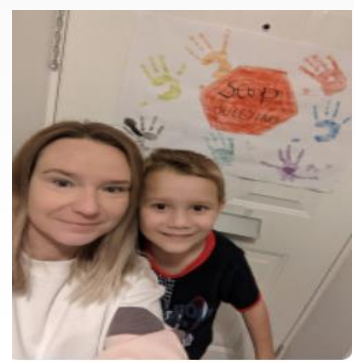
