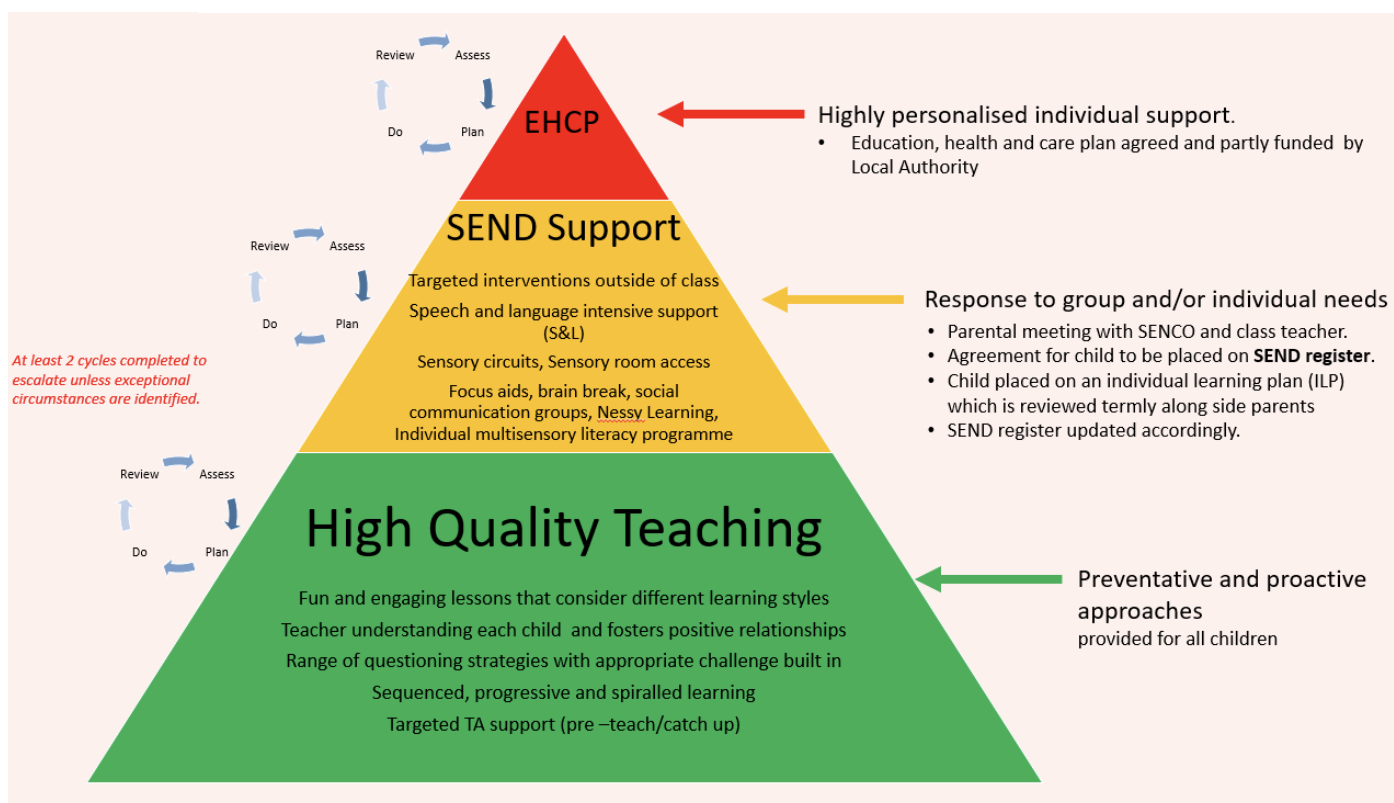

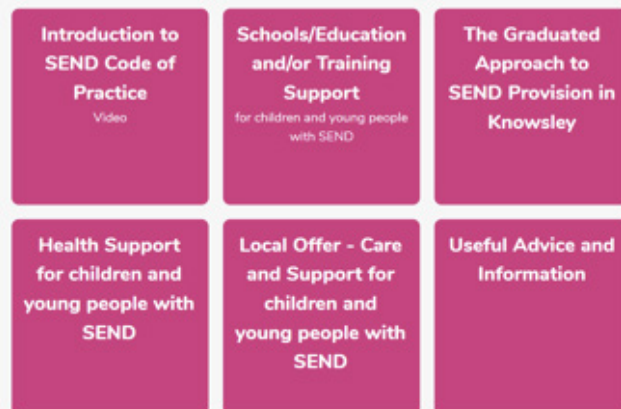


SEND AND INCLUSION IN THE CLASSROOM
